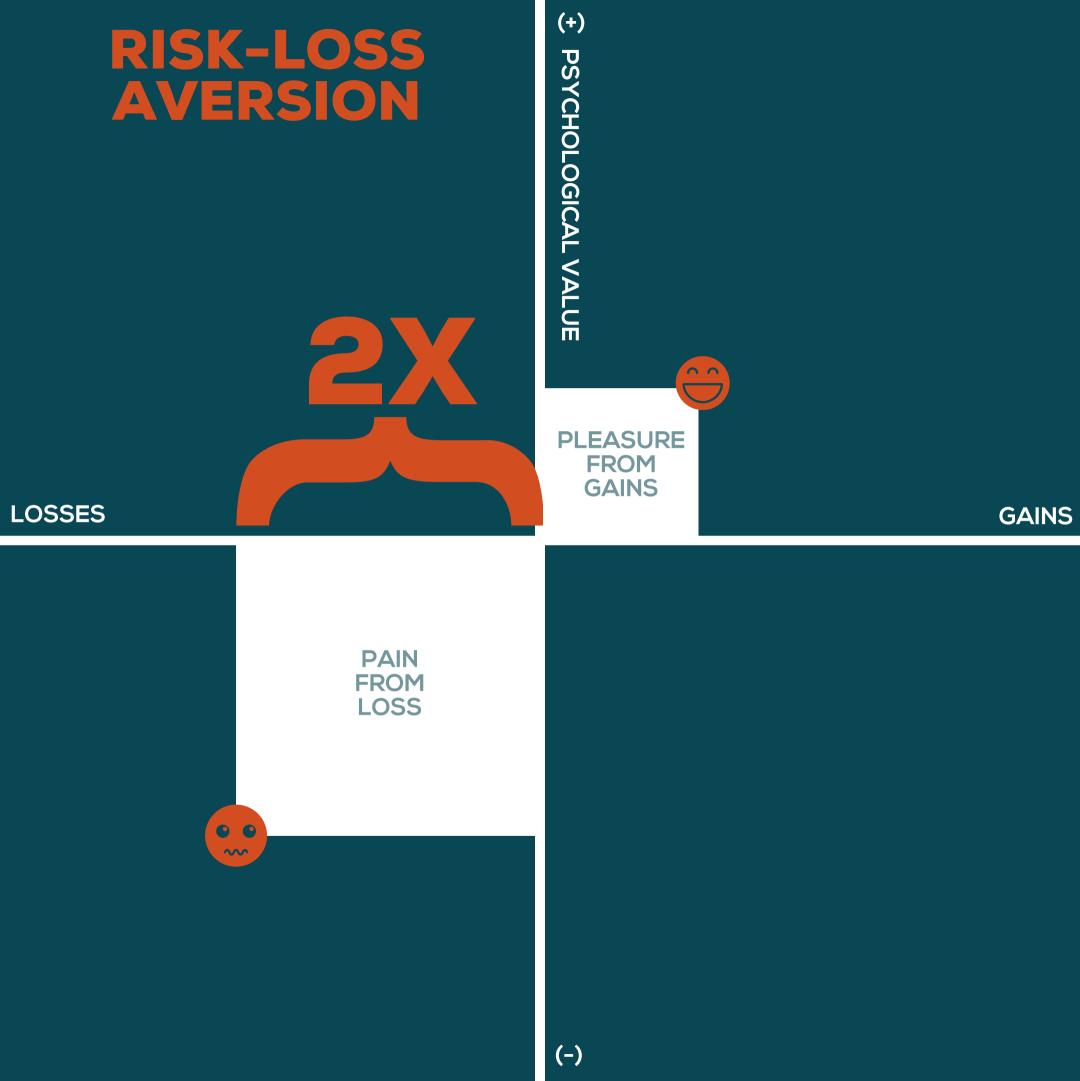
THINK OF AN INFLUENTIAL PERSON YOU KNOW

Humans: we're complicated and emotional







DON'T WORRY You don't have to run around frightening people

Simply Frame Up:

- New risks on the horizon
- Unmet customer needs
- A peek at an uncertain future
- Downside to sticking with status quo
- How things will take a dip in the future
- Ways the situation has changed, yet most people haven't noticed yet

Important: don't make them sound foolish for not seeing the risk yet

Influence: Use emotions as data



Influence: All feelings are not Hallmark emotions



HARD DATA ON "SOFT" SKILLS

Only 11% of employees fail at work because they lack technical competence for the job.

The other 89% of the time, it's a lack of "soft" skills.

To be more influential, invest in your people skills.

EASY! EASY! EASY!

1. Smaller chunks

Example: Problem - ops team won't reply to me. Solution - move from weekly update to discrete action requests.



1. Smaller chunks 2. Closed-ended options

Example: "Reply with a simple yes or no." "Do you prefer A, B, or C?"

This will get you a faster answer than "Your thoughts?" EASY! EASY! EASY!

 Closed-ended options
 Give something to react to

"I drafted some initial thoughts. If this feels like the right direction, feel free to edit this document directly"

Communicate in a way that honors the listener. It's like an un-muffled "mask conversation" - everything gets clearer so that it's easy to listen.



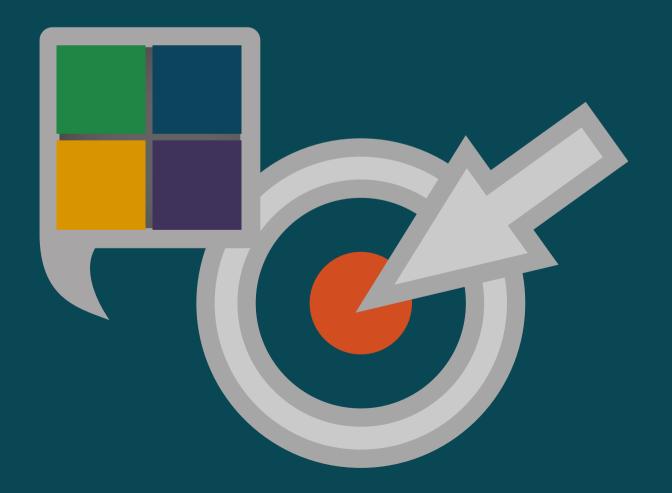
DIAGNOSE WHY YOU'RE NOT GETTING THROUGH TO THEM
